

FACTS

1. Coordinated Care reduces the number of children referred to Clinical Committee by providing intensive services in the home and at school.
2. Coordinated Care has reduced the number of Clinical Committee children in residential placement steadily since 2001.
3. Diversion has reduced the number of Unruly charges filed and subsequently diverted away from Juvenile Court steadily since 2002.

MISSION

Dedicated to providing prevention, support and intervention to Warren County youth and their families struggling with emotional and behavioral needs so that they may remain in their own home.

COORDINATED CARE TEAM

The Coordinated Care Team provides wraparound, intervention and prevention services to high risk and multi-need children and their families. The goals of the Coordinated Care Program are to create a prevention component to support children and families earlier in the process, monitor and support multi-need children in placement to shorten stays, help multi-need children avoid out-of-home placement and provide aftercare and support for children released from placement. Coordinated Care works with direct service providers to develop an Individualized Family Service Coordination Plan to help meet the needs of the child within the community.

CLINICAL COMMITTEE

The Clinical Committee is a committee of the Warren County Family and Children First Council. The Clinical Committee is composed of representative from the Warren County Board of Developmental Disabilities, Juvenile Court, Children Services and Mental Health Recovery Services of Warren & Clinton Counties.

Clinical Committee focuses on administering comprehensive services and care for high risk, multi-need youth in Warren County. The Clinical Committee is committed to serving children in the least restrictive environment as possible.

DIVERSION PROGRAM

The goal of the Diversion Program is to prevent and reduce unruly behavior. Diversion provides home and school-based case management and therapeutic services to unruly children and their families.

ATTEND

ATTEND (Absence Truancy Tardy Eliminate Now Docket) is a court-ordered truancy program that provides intensive case management services to Warren County's most chronically truant families in order to reduce obstacles to consistent school

PARENT SUCCESS

Parent Success is an innovative program that is funded by the Ohio Children's Trust Fund. The goal of Parent Success is to provide education and support to parents of school-aged children with behavioral issues. A Prevention Specialist provides at least four home visits to identify concerns unique to the family unit and offers support, education and solutions. The Parent Success Program utilizes an evidenced-based curriculum.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL EDUCATION AND PREVENTION

Coordinated Care offers Drug and Alcohol Prevention and Education Services to Warren County Schools at NO COST to the district. Services include but are not limited to Red Ribbon Week presentations/displays, tobacco education groups, substance abuse education groups, speaking at community and sporting events, speaking to Health and other classes, and Prom/Homecoming presentations.
